User Experience: the broader person-technology relationship; how people feel about interacting with a technology





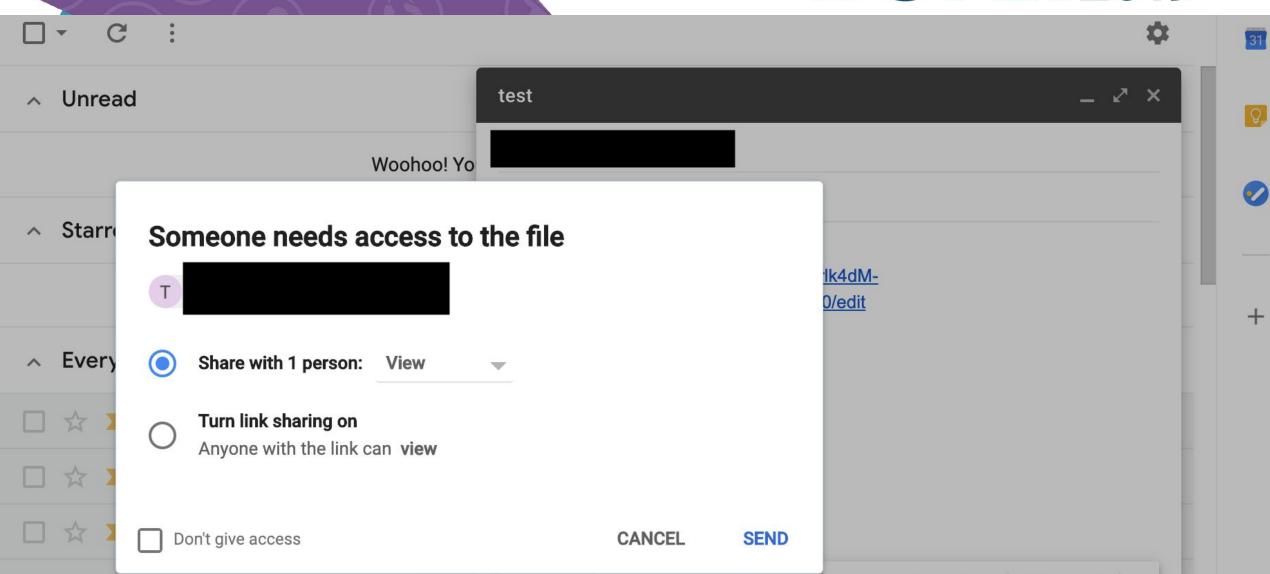
